After almost two years in the making, we are particularly proud and excited to report that both Benin and Uganda have adapted the Management Performance Assessment Tool (MPAT), with Benin being the first to pilot the Tool. Read more about what we are trying to achieve in the blog below.

Kenya completed Diagnostic Study of the Gender Responsiveness of the National Integrated Monitoring and Evaluation System (NIMES). The study was commissioned by the National Treasury and Planning (Ministry) through the Monitoring and Evaluation Directorate with support from

Twende Mbele. The results are fairly consistent with other countries who have

completed the tool, and we look forward to working with Kenya as they implement the recommendations.

In January this year, Ghana hosted its inaugural Results Fair, to showcase that countries government project results and impact on its citizens. Twende Mbele sponsored representatives from nine African to this very important date in the Ghanaian calendar. Just before the start of the Fair, Twende hosted a Learning Event to showcase some of the lessons emerging from the countries.

The M&E baseline study for the five countries - Benin, Uganda, Ghana, South Africa and Kenya, is completed and a synthesis report on the findings will follow soon. Red hot discussion on these results during the recent Learning Event demonstrated that there is no 'one way' to build a learning culture, and that the promotion of an integrated M&E system is part of the journey!

Twende Mbele Learning Event

To encourage learning across the continent, Twende Mbele hosted a one-day lessons learnt event.

The day hosted officials from a range of Francophone and Anglophone countries, who engaged in activities to foster new thinking and problem solving. The workshop focused on what can be learnt about adapting tools into government, how to build a positive M&E culture, and potential ways to use M&E systems to reach equity goals.

Some insights gathered:

- * Building in ownership at the start of a reform is a necessary task, and should not be skipped in order to move more quickly.
- * In terms of promoting equity: Partnering with other organisations can help improve the conceptual understanding of equity with policy makers. Capacity building should include some information on the economic and social benefits of achieving equity targets so as to assist policy makers to embed equity into different public policies, preferably through a sectoral approach.



The three-day event themed: "Delivery results for citizens work in progress". The Ministry of Monitoring and Evaluation on 14 January 2020 opened its maiden result fair to enable Ministries, Department and Agencies interact with citizens, civil society and the media to explain progress of implementation and achievements of government's flagship programmes and other strategic interventions.
